

These words of St. Jeanne Jugan speak of the place that is truly the heart of St. Joseph's home – our chapel. Our most important Resident can always be found there, although He is not listed in our daily census. The tabernacle of the chapel holds the Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity of Jesus Christ. His presence radiates throughout the home, touching the lives of the Residents, staff, Little Sisters, and all those who visit.

Little Sisters and Residents go to the chapel to visit to Our Lord throughout the day, and staff members often stop by the chapel before beginning their shift. The Mass is the highlight of each day, and on four evenings each week, all are invited for a half-hour of adoration of the Blessed Sacrament and Evening Prayer with the Little Sisters. We asked some of our Residents for their reflections on the Eucharist.

When I ask him for something, I know that He will take care of it, either give me strength or take care of my problem, and that gives me comfort."
